Region 1 Report - Pamela Remley

June 16, 2021

The Hybrid Meeting was called to order at 7:06 PM by Pamela Remley, Region 1 Director. The meeting was attended by 5 delegates, 3 officers, and 3 guests, representing 3 clubs. (The meeting was held as a hybrid virtual and in-person meeting due to relaxing but still in-force restrictions from the Governor that limit in-person meetings.) There was a virtual Flag Salute; the Pledge of Allegiance; and a moment of silence for the ill and departed.

Guests: Nichol Phillips, TriPower Editor, PR Board; Gary Tomlinson and Gary Henderson of NWJeepcast.com.

Secretary Report:* As published in the Tri-Power. Motion made for acceptance and seconded. The motion passed.

Correspondence: * No correspondence.

Directors Report: The Board Meeting of 6/5/2021 at the LeMay Museum in Tacoma was good but mostly uneventful. Trail Jamboree details were discussed. It was also noted that Trail Runs and Competitions are resuming. Pam announced that she has accepted her old job back again which is in Eastern Washington and that she will be moving there. Much discussion ensued, mostly that the delegates and other officers have greatly appreciated Pam's directorship, and there is a unanimous desire to have her continue as Director. A motion was made and seconded to have Pam continue as Director, realizing that some meetings may need to have her lead them virtually. The motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Profit & Loss statement shows a total of \$0.39 of interest accrued since last month—almost 3 times last month's interest accrual! No other activity in the accounts.

Land & Legislative: North End Representative, Kevin is not present; the report is from Casey who attended the meeting. It was a short meeting. The Bypass at around "the rock" at the top of Ron's Run has been approved and will happen; it is now in the planning phase. The Dirty 13 Club added about 100 M&O hours to Walker with a project to change and update signage along Peter Burns Road as well as several signs on trails. South End Representative, Ed gave the report. There are still no official work parties, but Mike "Krash" Kash is still doing his less official Friday work. There was discussion to look into having trails adopted by clubs in hopes of begin able to maintain them better and (hopefully) help decrease some trail damage if there is recognition and awareness that the maintenance is by clubs, not the DNR. There is a desire that at least the Tight & Twisty Trail be adopted either by Region 1 or a Club. ACTION ITEM: Proposed to have the Delegates discuss this at their club

meetings and return at the next Region 1 meeting with direction on whether to have the sponsorship of trails at Reiter by Region 1 as a whole or by individual clubs (or maybe by 1-2 clubs)—with emphasis on the Tight & Twisty. (It was noted that there has been some urging to modify the Tight & Twisty to accommodate all 4x4 vehicles and no longer restrict it to the only short wheelbase and relatively narrow vehicles.) Legislation: Nichol reported that Lisa Chissus (Washington State Director) talked with the PNW Board about spill kits; the hope is to start assembling them (if not distributing them) sometime in June. However, it is recognized that they might not be all ready until OSP in September. Some kits will be assembled at Trail Jamboree.

Competition: Joe May (Competition Representative) is not present, so Pam gave the update. Pam has been posting information and results on Facebook. There was a discussion about the current rules.

ACTION ITEM: Pam will get a copy of the Competition Rules to share. (Nichol sent out the Comp Rulebook to the Groups.IO list while the meeting was going on.)

printed out, SIGNED, then scanned and e-mailed to be submitted back to Angie. Angie requests that even trail work forms for E&E and M&O be sent to her to help report that this work is being done. Please send copies of any letters or e-mails sent to state senators and representatives also be copied (or “CC’d”) to her for the Quill Power reports so we can keep track of what legislative measures are being addressed.

Membership: No new inquiries.

PR: No report. However, Pam will need to relinquish this responsibility with her now moving to Eastern Washington.

Featured Club: Dirty 13 hosted the meeting tonight. They now have only 9 members due to attrition over the years. They performed the work updating signage at Walker Valley over Labor Day Weekend that is described in the North End Report under Land & Legislative in these meeting minutes.

Region Report: Bullshiffters: no report. Dirty 13: As described under the Featured Club Report. Doo Wop

Ditty: no report. Happy Campers: no report. Off Road Express: no report. Outdoor 4x4: no report.

Rainier Ridge Rams: Had an in-person meeting. Did a river bar trail run. Planning a possible club run to Tahuya. Still working on planning Trail Jamboree. Timber Tamers: Meetings still virtual. There have been a few snow runs with snow being found at higher elevations. There’s a run to Clockum this weekend. Lots of new members coming in—something like 19 in the past 3-4 months. A trip to Montana (Missoula and Kalispell venues) is being planned for July; so far 7 rigs have committed. Wandering Willys: no report. Washington Bobtails: no report.

Action List Follow-Up: Message that Work Parties at Walker are suspended until further notice in listings of upcoming events; this has been addressed by the Secretary. The raffle is being skipped this month. Ideas for OSP Promotional items. Discussed at length again this meeting. Several suggestions, but consistent agreement with the badging of some sort (medallions, badges, dash plaques) for the participants, with remaining funds to go to purchasing door prizes for the participants. (All of these were supported by the Dirty 13, Rainier Ridge Rams, and the Timber Tamers.) The Delegates will again discuss these suggestions at their club meetings.

Old Business: Metal Plaques: Ed presented an option of whether to pursue Region 1 stickers for the plaques versus PNW stickers. This was discussed, and it was decided to pursue Region 1 stickers. Ed stated he’d get this going. RRC: had to be canceled this year due to the inability for DNR to issue a permit unencumbered by COVID restrictions until at least June 30—which will be too late to feasibly then cancel if the event cannot be pursued without COVID encumbrments. Plans are now to hold RRC in 2022. Trail Jamboree: Registration is full and is now closed. The positions that were potential opportunities for a Waiting List also have been filled. Still need Camp Hosts. The shirt design has just been completed. There will be an internet survey of the event afterward. Participants will get a badge

this year instead of a dash plaque. Operation Shore Patrol: Casey asked Nichol about the T-shirts; Nichol said that Kyle has indeed completed work on the Trail Jamboree T-Shirts; now that this is completed, he should have the bandwidth to work on the OSP T-Shirts. The Timber Tamers will decide at tomorrow's meeting whether there will be a dinner (noting that COVID restrictions are slated to be removed on June 30). Contact Dave at the Tidelands Campground (360-289-8963) to make camping reservations.

New Business: There is an advanced Chainsaw Certification event scheduled in Zigzag, Oregon on July 7-11 and July 21-25. Pam sent an e-mail with information on this event on 6/6/2021; please refer to that e-mailing for further details. There is a request for Door Prizes for Trail Jamboree. After discussion, it was moved, seconded further discussed, and then passed to allocate \$200 to cover two \$100 Amazon gift cards to donate as door prizes. NWJeepcast All Jeep Show slated for 7/24/2021 at the Cook Brothers' Farm in Carnation, WA from 9:00 AM-4:00 PM. Originally at XXX Rootbeer in Issaquah, but COVID restrictions and space precluded that for this year. (The last time this was held there were 205 registrants, and 350 rigs showed up!) Cook Brothers' Farm has a stage and a racetrack as well as being simply a much larger venue. 8 Sponsors so far with Northridge 4x4 being the Major Sponsor. There will be open (free) booths for clubs, and they would like to have a PNW-sponsored booth.

Tickets are \$20, with \$5 to the PNW, \$5 to Cook Brothers' Farm; the Raffle proceeds will be sent to Children's Hospital. Non-Jeeps may attend but are not allowed in the competitions.

Good of the Order: Noted the situation of Luke and Tori Parker who have newborn very will twins. Moved and seconded to donate \$200 cash card. The motion PASSED. George Steele (a very long-time PNW member who is now quite ill) would appreciate visitors.

Action Items: Delegates are to discuss with their clubs the situation of sponsorship of the Tight & Twisty Trail at Reiter; specifically, whether they recommend it be sponsored by the full Region 1 or whether it should be adopted by one or two Region 1 Clubs.

Raffle: Not held as this is not fully an in-person meeting.

PNW4WDA BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

JUNE 5, 2021

President Kyle Wiebold (Push & Pulls, Our Gang Offroad, Sand Fleas, and RPM Racing) called the meeting to order at 8:51 AM at the LeMay Car Museum in Tacoma, WA. We immediately went into recess and moved to the 3rd floor for our special team-building event. The meeting reconvened at 10:05 AM in the Club Auto Room with the Flag Salute and a moment of silence for the sick and departed. Treasurer and Trail Jamboree Chairman Dave McMains (The Hurtin' Units) joined the meeting by Zoom as he is recovering from COVID. The following Board members were not present: COMP Chairman Steve Zentner (Push & Pulls & RPM Racing) was at a work party at Ethel; Region 3 Director Kristin Smith (Flat Broke & 4-Wheelin', Sand Fleas, & Hubs in 4-Wheelers) was out of town but sent her Vice-Director; Region 6 Director Alan Paulson (Umpqua Valley Timber Cruisers); at this time we do not have an Oregon State Director, Idaho State Director, Ways & Means, or Region Directors for 5,7 and 8.

President Statement: President Kyle said it was great to finally be able to see everyone in person and he thanked our WA State Executive Director Lisa Chissus (The Hurtin' Units) for setting up this meeting for us.

Minutes: IAD #2 Carol Jensen (Individual Members Club & Sand Fleas) made a motion seconded by Region 4 Director Skip Frans (Trail Seekers & Cascade 4X4's) that we approve the minutes from the March 6, 2021, Board meeting held on ZOOM; motion carried.

Treasurer's report - Dave McMains had a written report. Dave said a couple of things have happened since he sent in his report. Work was completed on the Campground Shelter Project at Elbe Hills, this project was submitted by Region 2 Director Jessica Bailey (Renegade Offroad & Doo Wop Ditty Dirt Club) Jessica worked with the DNR on this project, and it was approved in 2019 but not completed then due to COVID. The Moonshiners paid a portion and the PNW picked up the balance. Donations to the Dianna Williams Scholarship Memorial Fund are coming in. Lisa Chissus made a motion that we add one more Scholarship in 2022 in memory of Dianna Williams for \$1,000 that would go to either a boy or girl (same Scholarship rules would apply) and the winner picked before the alternates are picked, this would be for one year; seconded by Skip Frans; motion carried.

Secretary – Sande Nettnin (Desert Rats) had a written report.

State Director's Reports

Idaho – Open

Oregon – Open

Washington – Lisa Chissus had a written report. Lisa gave an update on the permit process. We finally received the permit for Trail Jamboree. Lisa would like to be able to take the District Ranger Aaron Stockton on the Naches Trail so he could see what a historical trail is like, don't know if this will happen or not. We also need the permit for the West Side. Discussion followed and the West Side doesn't open

until the 15th of July, so we are working on trying to get that permit also. We need to document everything our organization does for education and work parties. We need to educate the Side By Sides, their rigs are not made for our trails as they like to travel on them at 40 to 60 mph. Lisa said she was wondering if we could get clubs to adopt a specific trail kind of like the Quadrapaws in Region 1 have their Newbie runs once a month to educate users. Discussion followed, a lot of things would need to be worked out, this needs to be discussed on the Region level also to get ideas from everyone, not just 20 people on how we might get things documented when we rescue people, etc. Lisa said she had good news, our grant for Spill Kits was approved. This is a 2-year grant. Spill Kits are to be used for education purposes. Lisa said we can get grants for Pick Up A Mountain (PUAM) and Operation Shore Patrol (OSP). They don't have to be a hundred thousand dollar project. Lisa included in her report a copy of the Milestone Worksheet so we could see the kind of information that's needed to apply for grants. Since this grant was for 2 years, Lisa wanted to know if we wanted to do half the kits this year and a half next year. Discussion followed and we have enough for Trail Jamboree this year, so it looks like we will do half of the kits this year and the other half next year. Lisa would like to have information included with the kits that say they were purchased with funds from an Education RTP grant. Lisa would like to have pictures that show the kits were used at events, she said that would be helpful when she applies for grants that show they are being used for education that shows we are being good stewards. The discussion then went to Operation Shore Patrol. T-Shirts still have a couple of spots left on the back for advertising. Flyers are needed for OSP and PUAM, they are being worked on. OSP is celebrating 50 years and PUAM 15 years. Kyle is in charge of getting the shirts for OSP.

IAD#1 & #2 Don, and Carol Jensen (Individual Members Club & Sand Fleas) had a written report. Carol said North American Motorized Recreation Council (NAMRC) is planning to meet on November 1st and they plan to attend, also at that time they will have a chance to meet with One Voice (ORBA) the Off-Road Business Association. Carol said ORBA and Tread Lightly are going to do some special things for Side X Sides, so they want to be able to sit in on that meeting also. If they find out if there is a Blue Ribbon meeting, they will attend that as well. The Sierra Club is still working very hard to stop climate change and pollution, so we need to be on top of this stuff.

Competition – Steve Zentner had a written report. He was not present as he was at Ethel for a work party getting things ready for the first event on June 12 & 13. They have built an RC car/truck racecourse on the Ethel property that will stay there. So Saturday night before trophies they will have a competitive race for kids and adults with a prize. Carol Jensen asked if Steve was to have presented a treasurer's report at this meeting, answer yes, so Kyle gave the report.

Region Reports

Region 1 Director Pam Remley (Rainier Ridge Rams) had a written report. Pam reminded everyone that the Reiter Rock Crawl was canceled. She said they still needed to submit their We Did It projects. Pam said she reminds her Region that they need to do this. Sponsorship Angie Marek (Spanaway Moonshiners) suggested maybe we should have an article in Tri-Power to explain why we need to be able to track our hours.

Region 2 Director Jessica Bailey had a written report. She reminded everyone that the Region 2 Fun Run has been canceled. She said they have one new club called NW on the Rocks. They are working on getting a place to hold face-to-face meetings. She said they still need a secretary and land matters person. They have been having ZOOM meetings. We really need to document what trails are open and what the condition of the trails are would be helpful. Updated signage on the trails would also be great.

Region 3 Director Kristin Smith had a written report, she was not present, but she sent her Vice Director Tony Jessen (Trailbreakers, Inc.). He said not much is happening. OSP has no official campground to stay in. Tony said we should have a proclamation signed by the Governor as it's our 50th Anniversary. Discussion followed as to who should contact the Governor, Don Jensen volunteered to contact someone he knew who might be able to get this for us.

Region 4 Director Skip Frans had a written report. Skip said some independent clubs have been going out and cleaning up areas and we have work to be done at Copper City and Government Meadows when the COVID restrictions are lifted. Region 4 has reserved Jim Sprick Park for PUAM. We have the flyer ready for PUAM, this will be our 15th year, we skipped 2020 because of COVID. We did our opening of trails in the Liberty area before Memorial weekend. Dave McMains said the Forest Service came to him and asked if the PNW would sponsor six outhouses in the Liberty area, Dave talked to Kyle and got approval to do this. Only one of them had garbage dumped in it and it was cleaned up by some of the users. The UTV's have been causing problems and tickets were issued. We need to have a place for them to run, our trails are not made for them to run on. Dave said the places we have for the Side X Sides are the Moses Lake Sand Dunes and Juniper Dunes. It's going to take a lot of education and patience getting the Side X Side group to tread lightly. 


