To be Voted on At Fall Delegates Meeting

CONSTITUTION AND BYLAW PROPOSAL FORM

ARTICLE III Dues SECTION 5

Constitution/Bylaw presently reads: Dues will be pro-rated for new clubs joining after January based on the twelve (12) month year from the first day of the month of their acceptance into the PNW4WDA to the next due date on the basis of the amount stated in Section 4 above, but not less than ten dollars (\$10.00)

Proposed Constitution/Bylaw amendment to read: Delete this section

INTENT: To do away with pro-rating of dues.

Date to Take Effect: Immediately upon passing

CONSTITUTION AND BYLAW PROPOSAL FORM

ARTICLE III Dues SECTION 6

Constitution/Bylaw presently reads: The voting member clubs may submit to the PNW4WDA Membership Chairman, listing of additional new individual club members, not more than once a month. Dues for those additional new member families will be pro-rated based on the number of the months remaining from the first day of the month submitted until the next due date and amount as stated in Section 4 above.

Proposed Constitution/Bylaw amendment to read: The voting member clubs may submit to the PNW4WDA Membership Chairman, a list of additional new individual club members, not more than once a month.

INTENT: To do away with the pro-rating of dues.

Date to Take Effect: Immediately upon passing

ARTICLE III Dues SECTION 11

Constitution/Bylaw presently reads: Individual member dues shall be forty dollars (\$40.00) per calendar year, pro-rated to the date of joining but not less than ten dollars (\$10.00), the first year only.

Club Report: The Washington Bobtails Club was to sponsor this evening's meeting. No report due to the quarantine.

Region Report: No report.

Old Business: Metal Plaques--No Report. Change of Venue; Delegates were reminded that when we can meet in person again, we will be meeting at Alf's Pizza (9620 19th Ave SE, Everett, WA 98208). This will be forwarded to Rich Holm to include this change on the PNW website. Ocean Shores Patrol. A message was prematurely sent out 2 days ago announcing that Region 1 will not be a sponsor for OSP this year; this was done after communication with Dave Taylor, Director of Region 1 (who agreed with canceling Region 1 sponsorship of OSP for this year). It was noted that the intent was for a vote at this evening's meeting. The officers involved with this premature announcement apologized; and the delegates unanimously asserted that Region 1 indeed should not be a sponsor for OSP this year due to liability concerns with COVID-19. However, it is noted that several people are planning to do beach clean-up anyway, just without official sponsorship. People are encouraged to contact Dave at

the Tidelands Campground (360-289-8963) either to make a reservation anyway, to confirm their reservation, or to cancel a current reservation if there are any changes; there are a few remaining open campsites. This is financially important for the Tidelands Campground for the winter. (Lisa Chissus noted that just earlier this evening, Region 3 also elected not to be a sponsor for OSP this year due to the COVID concerns.) Replacement for the Yahoo Groups list. Rudi brought up that many former Yahoo Groups have moved to Groups.io as a new hosting platform since Yahoo is no longer supporting any Groups. Rudi noted that Groups.io has a robust platform that can essentially roll-over all the prior information from Yahoo Groups.

New Business: 2021 Region 1 Officers. It is necessary to start nominations for 2021 Officers next month; our rules require two months for nominations before voting; since we have no December meeting, this means we must start nominations in September—which is our next meeting. Dave Taylor will not be able to continue as Director, so please give consideration for whom to nominate for this position for 2021. Also, there was much discussion regarding when the new Director will start in that position. The vote is in November, and the current Director is in office and runs the January Delegates Meeting. The new Director is sworn-in at the Winter Convention in early February; then the new Director presides over his/her first meeting in February—which is almost always after the Winter Convention. Also, the current Director still is in office for the Winter Convention.

Good of the Order: Nichol Phillips requested that all clubs that are looking for new member send a link to her to facilitate this through the PNW. Lisa Chissus stated that they are looking for volunteers to help with repair work on the Naches Trail near Government Meadows. Those able and interested are requested to contact Ron Rutherford to coordinate this. Lisa Chissus also noted that at the September Fall PNW Delegates Meeting there will be a vote on the proposed Bylaws changes eliminating pro-rating of dues. This Delegates Meeting will be a virtual meeting, and the Delegates are encouraged to get input from the club members before voting on this item in the Delegates Meeting. (It will be a virtual meeting due to continued COVID-10 concerns; it is the 2nd Saturday of September, which this year is September 12, 2020.

New Business- Overboard Racing event occurs Labor Day weekend at 1807 Glenwood Hwy, Glenwood, WA.

Skip announced the RCO membership cards have been received in the mail.

Lisa said she participated in an RCO webinar on the 10th. She reported they are accepting grants and there are no matching requirements.

When reporting volunteer hours, those hours accumulated with "intent" also count, meaning that if you go out equipped to work, planning to work, but don't find any work needing to be done, those hours count as "intent".

REGION 6 DELEGATES MEETING- NO REPORT

Sponsorship Report - Angie Marek

Hi everyone, I can't believe it is September already. I first want to say a huge THANK YOU to everyone who participated in the recent PNW4WDA Partner Webinar Series as well as, our sponsors and presenters. We as an organization appreciate everything our Sponsors/Partners and Associate Members do to help strengthen the PNW4WDA. Please support those who support us! A list of all Partners and Associate Members can be found in Tri-Power and on the PNW4WDA.org website.

I want to share a little about our recent webinars and then there will be a more detailed report for Fall Delegates Meeting.

The first one was on July 15th and was sponsored by our partner Olympia Jeep. The webinar Ropes, Straps & Shackles OH MY! was presented by Richard and Tim from Freedom Recovery Gear. We had 40 people log on for the webinar, out of those who filled out the survey 95% were either Extremely Satisfied or Very Satisfied and the remaining 5% were Somewhat Satisfied. Richard & Tim did a great job of explaining the difference in straps and displayed different ways to increase your pulling strength.

The second one was held on August 12th and was sponsored by our partner Northridge 4x4. This webinar focused on different suspension and how it affects your rigs. Eric Johnson, a longtime member of the PNW4WDA and Sales Supervisor for Northridge 4x4 shared some great information and answered many of your questions. We had 38 people log on and out of those 76% were either Extremely Satisfied or Very Satisfied and the 24 % were varied between Somewhat Satisfied and having more questions.

The third in the series was sponsored by our partner Warn Industries, Inc. Warn has long supported our Association throughout the three states. Andy Lilenthal, Strategic Communication Manager at Warn presented Basic Winching Techniques with the help of his lovely assistant (his wife) Mercedes. We had a little bit of delay in the video due to internet connection but still were able to get some great information. As with many of you, Andy has been working from home and was able to utilize his personal vehicles to demonstrate. This was the largest group so far participating as we had over 50 people log on. Andy demonstrated different ways to attach cables, where to attach and the strength of the pull. We are excited he has agreed to present another workshop showing advanced winching options. On this survey 75% were either Extremely Satisfied or Very Satisfied, 17% Somewhat Satisfied with 8% listing other.
