Washington Off-Highway Vehicle Alliance (WOHVA) presented on their Heavy Maintenance Crews that are working on trail maintenance. WOHVA acknowledged the Pacific Northwest 4 Wheel Drive Association and the National Motorized Association (NMA) to all of the user groups that were a part of this caucus. WOHVA plans to not just work on existing trails but expand motorized trails as well.

A lot of conversation about collaboration with all user groups. Comments like "There Are No Competitors" and "We are all in the dirt" came from the Evergreen group. Hope to continue this movement in determining how our public land gets used. We must have a presence with the Recreation and Conservation Office so that they understand how we and where we use trails! ### **Region 1 Report - Pamela Remley**

October 20, 2021

The Virtual Meeting was called to order at 7:14 PM by Pamela Remley, Region 1 Director. The meeting was attended by 5 delegates and, 3 officers, representing 3 clubs. (The meeting was held as a virtual meeting due to restrictions from the Governor that restrict in-person meetings.)

There was a virtual Flag Salute and a moment of silence for the ill and departed.

Guests: None.

Secretary Report: As published in the Tri-Power. Motion made for acceptance and seconded.

The motion passed.

Correspondence: None.

Directors Report: The only update from last month is that Kyle announced that the Winter Convention will still be the 2<sup>nd</sup> weekend in February (February 11-13, 2022 in Vancouver, WA).

Treasurer's Report: We had \$0.12 of interest income for the month. Gross income from OSP was \$4525, with \$2150 from the Raffle and \$2375 from T-shirt sales. Not all the bills are in just yet, so the final Net Proceeds can't yet be calculated to the penny. Current Total Assets are about \$30,500. A motion was made to accept the Treasurer's Report and was seconded. The motion passed. Land & Legislative: North End Representative: Reported by Casey. Summary of an e-mail from Hilary Franz, State Commissioner of Public Lands, is that it will be required that all DNR employees, contractors, and volunteers be vaccinated for COVID-19. Jim Cahill noted that there was no provision or process directed for doing these checks—as well as having concerns for possible privacy conflicts under HIPAA. As such, no volunteer projects (M&O) will be planned until this is resolved. However, all-volunteer hours may be designated as E&E work, as all E&E hours are still OK without checking COVID status.

(As it is, all-volunteer hours for the current biennium have been satisfied.) Also, the Tooler Trail is closed for repairs from October 19 through the end of the year. (This is a single-track trail, but it's important to announce this as many trail-users utilize more than one type of motorized

recreation on DNR lands. South End Representative: No report as Ed is not here. However, an e-mail noted that Ben is temporarily covering in Olympia as the statewide Recreation Policy Manager. In the interim, John Moon may be contacted for issues involving Reiter. Legislation: No update.

Competition: Joe May (Competition Representative) is not present. Pam noted that Racing Season is essentially finished for the year. Skip Frans is going to plan for replacement race radios, but this will be deferred to either the December Board Meeting or Winter Convention to approve the expenditure.

Club Power/ We Did it/ Quill Power: No new report. Please forward to Angie Holm of Happy Campers Club. \*\* aholm02@hotmail.com (mailto:aholm02@hotmail.com)

. On these forms, the most important item for the Forest Service is the Hours Worked. This is important to report the volunteer hours we give. The form is available on the PNW Website. The form needs to be printed out, SIGNED, then scanned and e-mailed to be submitted back to Angie. Angie requests that even trail work forms for E&E and M&O be sent to her to help report that this work is being done. Please send copies of any letters or e-mails sent to state senators and representatives also be copied (or "CC'd) to her for the Quill Power reports so we can keep track of what legislative measures are being addressed. Pam requested that any communications or letters sent regarding the situation with the Quack Attack Trail in Oregon should also be copied/pasted to Angie. (See below under Good of the Order.)

Membership: No report.

PR: No report.

Featured Club: The Dirty 13 hosted the meeting tonight.

Region Report: Bullshiffters: no report. Dirty 13: some members attended OSP, and there was a run to the Cle Elem area. Doo Wop Ditty: no report. Happy Campers: no report. Off-Road Express: no report. Outdoor 4x4: no report. Rainer Ridge Rams: The only event was participating with OSP. Timber Tamers: Also, mostly just participated with OSP. Also, there will be a Welcome Run to Walker Valley this weekend for new members. Wandering Willys: no report. Washington Bobtails: no report.

Action List Follow-Up: No items from last month for the Action List.

Old Business: Metal Plaques: Ed was not present for a report. However, when the plaques were discussed with Jim Cahill at the Walker Valley meeting, he stated that ALL signage must be approved through DNR—a couple of levels above him. More information will be needed, but we might not be allowed to post these trail-work plaques. Operation Shore Patrol: It was a great

success, despite having rain—but at least the rain held off during the time trash was collected. It was also noted that there was a lot less trash on the beaches than in the past—probably a good thing, especially with the difficulties arranging for the dumpsters beforehand (and not even mentioning the difficulties with those dumpsters being delivered to the wrong beach, causing some last-minute, er, “challenges”...)

New Business: Expo Website renewal payment is due as of November 1 or 3; this is about \$200. The last Expo was in 2018 and there have been significant difficulties finding a venue. Prior discussion after 2018 had been to continue payments for about 2 years. After discussion, a motion was made not to renew the Expo Website and was seconded. The motion passed. Carl recalled that the intent was that if Expo was discontinued, the funds should go to the Trails Fund. This decision was tabled pending review to confirm this intent. Nominations for 2022 officers: Director: Pam was renominated, she declined. Carl was nominated, he declined. Jeff was nominated, he declined. John was nominated, he tentatively accepted, but stated he could not do both Secretary and Director roles. Vice Director: Jayson was nominated, not present to accept, or decline. Kevin was nominated, not present to accept, or decline. Treasurer: Casey was nominated, she accepted. Secretary: John was nominated; he tentatively accepted with the contingency that he cannot be both Secretary and Director. PR: Pam was nominated; she accepted. Membership: Pam was nominated; she accepted. Land & Legislation: This had been split last year into North and South regions, with Kevin and Ed sharing the position. Both Kevin and Ed were renominated, but neither was present to accept or decline. Region 1 Tablecloth Discussion. The Agenda item of whether to ship the Region 1 tablecloth to the Director was resolved prior to this meeting. (It was decided that if it is stored with a responsible member, that is fine.)

Good of the Order: Driving through streams; Curt noted that there have been several incidents of people driving through streams and into waterways and tearing them up—even in the Hoh Rainforest and other places on the Olympic Peninsula in particular. There is also an issue of campsites being “expanded”—especially a problem at Gallagher Lake and near Lake Cle Elm. He noted that we already lost Surprise Lake due to abuse like this in that area. Curt also noted that people have posted this activity on Social Media, and when he has responded that this behavior causes us to lose land access, he has been “shouted down” and attacked. David asked that he be notified when this happens, as he has been successful in mobilizing a robust response to these Social Media situations. The discussion was that we are urged to respond to these situations both to educate and to help raise awareness of the sensitivity of waterways and streams and that not taking care of them will result in our loss of access to recreational lands. (It was also stated that vehicle manufacturers’ advertising of off-highway vehicles bashing through streams does little but worsen the situation.) Quack Attack

Trail in Oregon; there has been drastic damage/destruction of a large section of this iconic trail by a snowmobile club in Oregon. So far, despite rather wide publicity of this, there has been a rather dismal response of letters of support to the Forest Service urging repair of this damage. Our members are encouraged to send letters or e-mail the Forest Service to urge repair of what is a premier trail in Oregon—part of our PNW! (Check Facebook on the PNW4WDA site for further information and an e-mail address to send letters to; please also copy Angie!) PNW4WDA Scholarship Awards; applications must be submitted to the PNW4WDA Secretary no later than the fall of the gavel at the Winter Convention. The applicant must have been a member of the PNW4WDA in good standing for at least 2 years to qualify—so be sure to have your kids listed as members of your family! Pam will send out an e-mail with the specific information for the scholarships.

One Under the Hill Gang class. Any qualifying licensed competitor ages 16 – 25. No wheelbase breakdown. No cylinder breakdown.

### **Section 3 Primary Courses**

Proposed rule to be added in competition section where applicable

Comp vehicles to have a main power disconnect switch to be located on the outside of the vehicle in a visible spot. Recommended location on the left rear of the vehicle.

#### **Intention:**

If the rig is rolled over or crashed and the driver is incapacitated or unable to shut it down, track personnel can kill the vehicle without putting themselves in harm's way.

I know quite a few rigs have their batteries mounted on the front now. I can completely understand that in order for this to get traction, we would have to be lenient and allow for disconnects to be located on the front.

### **Section 4 – Team Relay**

Rule to be installed where applicable.

I propose the removal of the club challenge team relay from Summer Convention in lieu of King & Queen/Prince & Princess elimination obstacle or another suitable replacement event.

This proposal does not apply to the traditional Region Relay Challenge only to Club Challenge.

#### **Intention:**

First, to properly staff a relay course according to the current PNW4WDA rule book is 29 bodies. This does not allow for the substitution of said bodies that wish to compete as well, that number could easily double over the course of the day.

Second, relay makes no provisions for the inclusion of our child competitors at Summer Convention. Due to the typically larger number of competitors at Summer Convention, & the

standard slow start that comes with getting relay underway, I do not believe the simple inclusion of the children would be a practical solution. The course used for the Region Challenge could be used with only minor adjustments for gates.

If racing multiple vehicles, drivers must have a tech card for each vehicle on any primary course and pay the applicable tech/vehicle fee. Driver must select only one vehicle to compete in secondary courses (king and queen, team relay, any other elimination course)

#### **Intention:**

To allow people to race more than one vehicle if they have paid for tech/vehicle fee

#### **Article 3. Section D Passengers**

Additional rule to add...

All passengers must be a minimum of 18 years old to ride with drivers 16 and older.

#### **Article 1, Section E Title – Roll cage and body requirements**

All vehicles are required to have a roof cover made of sheet metal or aluminum to provide structural stability and safety in the event of a rollover. The top must be securely fastened without compromising the structure of the existing roll cage.

**Region 4 Report - Skip Frans**

October 12th, 2021

Called to Order: Meeting called to order at 7:02 p.m. followed by a flag salute, with a flag provided by Gary Lease aka Montana Flash, and a request for prayers for those dearly departed with special words for Les Thomas and his ill father.

Dave McMains motioned to accept minutes as posted, Ed Massey seconded. Motion passed.

Per request, Skip Frans will begin emailing the minutes next month as well as posting them on the PNW4WDA web page.

Secretary's Report: None

Treasurer's Report verbal only: Monthly Zoom bill to be paid. Melody Frans motioned that Mike and Amber get reimbursed \$215.30 for the screws they provided to use to reinforce the bridge at Government Meadows. Earl Nettnin seconded. Motion passed.

Club Power/We Did it: No report Ron Rutherford reported he went to Government Meadows for the bridge reinforcement. He stated the project went well, thanks to the PNW. PNW paid Forest Service for the timbers used for the bridge reinforcement.

Land Matters: Ron Rutherford reported the Naches trail has crossings that need to be rebuilt next year, the last couple of weeks of July, coming from the cabin heading east is a second one, roughly 21 feet. Needed for the project: stringers underneath, decking, concrete blocks – all to be rebuilt. Mike and Chad will meet with Ron to create a supply list.

Ron stated he would submit a form to represent 4-Wheel-Drive for the Snyder Springs Fire Bear.

Rattlesnake Trail structures were burnt beyond use and will be closed all next year, except for travel use. There are 6 system trails and 2 user trails.

The following four-wheel-drive system trails have been affected:

#696 Clover Springs / Mud Springs 8.5 miles

#697 Glass Creek 3.4 miles

#695 Schneider Springs Trail 1.7 miles

#620 Main Rattlesnake 2.5 miles

#680 Little Rattlesnake 2.5 miles

#325 Bethel Ridge 5.5 miles

Approximately 24 miles

Trail Jam location is to be determined due to trail closures caused by fires, i.e. Rattlesnake, Little Rattlesnake, Mud Springs, etc. (See PNW minutes – fall delegates under Lisa’s report).


