Washington Executive Report- Lisa Chissus

Legislation (H.R. 1864) to reauthorize the Recreational Trails Program (RTP) has been introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives. As you are likely aware the RTP is arguably the most important government program ever created to benefit the OHV community. RTP utilizes funds collected from federal gas taxes to pay for trail construction, maintenance, and education for both motorized and non-motorized recreation. Below is a press release from the bill sponsors about the recently introduced legislation:

The bipartisan bill makes critical reforms and provides at least \$250 million to support recreational trails.

WASHINGTON – Representatives Peter Welch (D-Vt.-At Large) and John Curtis (R-Utah-3) reintroduced legislation that will more than double funding for the Recreational Trails Program (RTP). Since 1991, the RTP has provided funding to states to develop and maintain outdoor recreational trails, allowing millions of Americans and their families to enjoy activities such as hiking, bicycling, cross-country skiing, snowmobiling, and 4-wheel driving.

“Our nation has an unparalleled natural beauty that provides year-round opportunities to enjoy the great outdoors,” said Rep. Welch. “The coronavirus pandemic has only increased Americans’ interest in getting outside to appreciate the recreational opportunities throughout the country. Boosting funding for this important program will ensure that future generations will experience the joy of hiking, riding, and exploring our scenic trails for many years to come.”

“The Recreational Trails Program has created countless opportunities for motorized recreation and human-powered experiences,” said Rep. Curtis. “This bill will ensure that future generations get to visit the great outdoors, while supporting local economies and jobs, especially throughout rural areas.”

“America’s large recreational trails community is grateful for the national leadership of U.S. Representatives Welch, Curtis and others to continue a great success story over the last 30 years – the Recreational Trails Program (RTP),” said Marianne Fowler and Derrick Crandall, Co-Chairs of the Coalition for Recreational Trails. “Every major trail organization supports the expansion of RTP using federal fuel taxes generated through nonhighway recreational activities to deliver healthy, safe, diverse, and exciting trail opportunities and to empower a partnership of federal land managers, state and local park and recreation agencies and trail enthusiasts. The serendipity is that the RTP is also proving to be a potent economic stimulus, supplying a vital base for the nation’s nearly-\$800 billion annual outdoor recreation industry.”

The bill will more than double RTP funding to at least \$250 million. The program is modeled after the Highway Trust Fund and is funded through taxes paid on gasoline used to fuel snowmobiles, ATVs, and other recreational vehicles that do not use highways. The program is currently funded at \$84 million annually, which is substantially less than is collected in taxes on fuel used by these vehicles.

The Recreational Trails Full Funding Act of 2021:

Requires the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) to estimate the amount of gas taxes paid by non-highway recreational users. Estimates suggest that those users pay more than \$270 million each year.

increases RTP funding to \$250 million or the mandated new FHWA estimate, whichever is higher.

Increases the transparency of the projects funded.

The legislation is also cosponsored by Reps. Michael F.Q. San Nicolas (D-Guam-At Large), Michael Simpson (R-Idaho-2), Chris Stewart (R-Utah-2), Jared Huffman (D-Calif.-2), Derek Kilmer (D-Wash.-6),

Tom O'Halleran (D-Ariz.-1), Marilyn Strickland (D-Wash.-10), Rick Larsen (D-Wash.-2), Richard Neal (D-Mass.-1), Steve Stivers (R-Ohio-15), and Grace F. Napolitano (D-Calif.-32).

President Kyle Wiebold (Push & Pulls, Our Gang Off-Road, Sand Fleas, and RPM Racing) called the Zoom meeting to order at 9:07 AM. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence for the

sick and departed was observed. Kyle asked that we remember the family of Dianna Williams (Go For All 4X4 Club) who passed away Friday night.

Not on the call: Membership Jessica Allen (Push & Pulls, Our Gang Offroad, Sand Fleas, and RPM Racing). Region 3 Director Kristin Smith (Flat Broke & 4-Wheelin', Sand Fleas, & Hubs in 4-Wheelers) and Region 6 Director Alan Paulson (Umpqua Valley Timber Cruisers). Currently, we do not have an Oregon State Director, Ways & Means, or Region 5, 7, and 8 Directors.

President Kyle thanked everyone for giving up a Saturday morning to be on the Board meeting by Zoom. He said things are slow, but we have hopes of things picking up soon. Trail Jamboree registration opened 8 minutes ago, and we will keep an eye on that. He then asked for approval of the December 5, 2020 Board minutes. A motion was made by Carol Jensen seconded by Dave McMains to accept the December 5, 2020 Board Minutes as printed; motion carried. He then asked for approval of the Emergency Board Minutes following Winter Convention. Dave McMains made a motion seconded by Carol Jensen to accept the Emergency Board Minutes following Winter Convention; motion carried.

Treasurer's Report. Dave McMains had a written report. He said his report is pretty much the same as at Winter Convention, money is coming in from dues. Carol said she needs a check for \$50 to renew the Oregon State Trademark. A question was asked about refunding money for insurance policies to clubs who had to cancel events last year, Carol said only one club had paid so that was taken care of. She said we need to be sure to list events on the policy this year if we are sure, they are happening as we do not want to lose this policy, we can always cancel an event if it does not happen. Lisa Chissus asked if money had been sent to Region 1, 2 & 3 to help them with Operation Shore Patrol – answer yes.

Secretary: Sande Nettnin had a written report. She reminded board members to get her a list of things you have in your possession that belong to the PNW. We need to keep a record of them.

IAD (Inter-Association Directors #1 & #2) Don and Carol Jensen did not have a written report. They said not much has happened since Winter Convention. We need to pay our Blue Ribbon Dues.

Competition Steve Zentner said not much has happened since Winter Convention, they are working on reformatting the COMP Book.

Region 1 Director Pam Remley had a written report. She said nothing much has changed other than they did have the work party on February 20th. Their region meetings are on Zoom.

Region 2 Director Jessica Bailey did not have a written report. She said they are working on getting positions filled. Their region meetings are on Zoom.

Region 3 Director Kristin Smith was not on the call and did not have a written report. They have not had a meeting since Winter Convention. They have one scheduled for later this month.

Region 4 Director Skip Frans did not have a written report. Skip said he had nothing new since Winter Convention. But they are going to be putting on a chain saw class. He wanted to know if the region had any safety equipment for saws. Answer no. Their meetings are on Zoom.

Region 6 Director Alan Paulson was not on the call and did not have a written report.

State Reports

Oregon – no report

WA State Director Lisa Chissus did not have a written report. She said she is working on getting the WOHVA sponsored Chain Saw class scheduled, and she would like one person from each region to take the class C Saw Class so they can train others. So far, she has no one from Region 2, Jessica Bailey said she is working on getting someone from Region 2. Region 1 Kevin Vanderhorst, Region 3 Kyle Wiebold, and Region 4 Les Thomas (Trail Seekers) and Dave McMains. As soon as she has all those names, she will work on setting up the class. Lisa said the Kathy Sterner award was delivered to Diana Stafford (Cascade 4X4's, Overbored Racing & County Line Offroaders). Lisa said she had a lengthy conversation with Jerry Ford (Naches Ranger District) about some issues with Copper City access with the Deep Creek Water Fall Bridge problems, Jerry said the new District Ranger Aaron Stockton responds well to emails and letters so Lisa forwarded a letter to him asking what we could do about fixing it. She also reached out to the Snowmobile Association asking them to send a letter concerning this bridge as well. Discussion followed and she said she was going to send us the contact information so we could write letters letting Aaron know that we use this area and feel it needs to be fixed. Lisa has been working on things at Reiter and Walker and she said equipment WOHVA purchased with grant funds is

not going to be suitable for what they need help with. She did say they were able to find the funds that were needed for repairs at Walker so that was good. No updates on the grant for Spill Kits yet.

Appointed Positions Reports

Membership Chairman Jessica Allen was not on the call, but she had a written report. We have 12 clubs that have not paid yet and 64 unpaid Individual Members.

Club Power/We Did It Quill Power Chairman Angela Holm had a written report. She said she only had received paperwork from the work party at Walker Valley on February 20, 2021. Angie Marek asked if we could have an article written up in Tri-Power about why we need to turn in information on work parties etc. Angela said she would write something up for Tri-Power.

Safety Education Chairman Rob Stafford did not have a written report, he said he is working on the Webinar for April 14th with the Lakewood Fire Department. There will be a fire extinguisher demonstration, as well as things we should have in our first aid kits. Lisa asked Rob about a candidate in Region 7 who is interested in helping get the region back up and going. His name is Kyle Murphy. President Kyle said he will reach out to him.

Trail Jamboree Chairman Dave McMains did not have a written report. He said he is working on the permit; it is filled out and on the District Rangers desk waiting for his signature. Dave said he had talked with Tammy Jorgenson at Jim Sprick Park and they are ready to go for Jamboree in July. They have a plan in place if COVID has restrictions so we should be good to go. However, they do not have a caretaker this year so we may have more duties to handle. Entertainment is scheduled. Dave said he had built the participant trail sign-up list and had added all the names from last year who wanted to be carried over. He said he would add the new sign-up names as they come in. He said he thought we were one host group short, but he has some names in reserve so he thinks we will be OK. We will have another committee meeting for Trail Jamboree on Saturday, March 27 at 9 AM on Zoom. Dave said he had told Tammy Jorgenson that he has put in the rules for camping at the park that we need to put a 24 X 24 landing pad down to keep the jacks from making holes in the grass. Skip Frans asked if Dave wanted him to put on a Ham Radio test session. Discussion followed and Skip will work with Dave to get information out. Pam Remley asked about Side X Sides if they would be allowed at Trail Jamboree. Dave said yes if they trailer their rigs to the trailhead. Discussion followed and so for this year we will not encourage them to be here, but next year we will have a plan in place.

Ways & Means is open, but Kyle has someone he is talking with so we may have someone soon.

WebMaster Rich Holm did not have a written report. He said he is working on updates and requests from board members.

Sponsorship Angie Marek did not have a written report. She said all letters have been sent to the Associate Members and information was updated. We now have a spreadsheet listing all our partners, new contributing partners, and our associate members; this was shared with the WebMaster. Sponsorship, Tri-Power, and Membership so we are all on the same page. The stickers/window clings have been well received. Angie said if you know of someone who might be interested in becoming a major partner or contributing partner, let her know; she will reach out to them. She talked about the Webinars that we have been having. The last one was supposed to have been a tour of the WARN factory but because of COVID and some other rules they were not able to do it at this time, however, they did put on a Webinar on bumpers and accessories, and they gave away one of their wireless hubs. Angie is working with Rob Stafford and the Lakewood Fire Department putting on our next Webinar that will be in April

14. Angie said special thanks to Billy Bob's Offroad for donating two of their new element fire extinguishers to be used for demonstration. As well as fire extinguishers they will talk about First Aid Kits and what should be in them. Angie thanked everyone for signing in and watching them.

PR and Tri-Power Nichol Phillips had a written report. She said she has been working with OSP (Operation Shore Patrol) on sponsorship t-shirts and we have 7 businesses, 6 clubs, and 4 regions and we only have 3 spots left. She is collecting logos and working with Dave to make sure people have paid. She will be sending the logos to Kyle so he can get them on the shirts. Social media is going well. She is working on the promotion of Trail Jamboree. Please send Nichol information you want her to promote. Lisa asked if anyone had reached out to the campgrounds to see if they wanted to be a sponsor and be listed on the back of the shirts, answer no one had done this but would check into it. The sale of the shirts will be handled by each region.

Video Don Jensen said nothing new.

Insurance Carol Jensen said she will be sending all requests for insurance to our insurance company on Monday to get the policy written up. Pick Up Mountain and OSP are volunteer events so we do not need insurance for them.

Dianna was born on December 7, 1945 and passed away unexpectedly at the age of 75 on March 5, 2021. She was born in Seattle and grew up in the Burien area.

She was a high school cheerleader and homecoming princess. These two roles were perfect for a lady with so much positivity and warm radiance. Dianna met her husband Don in high school, and they were voted best dancers of their class. They were still dancing together 53 years later and were very much in love. Don and Dianna were married in October of 1967 and moved to China Lake, California, and later to San Diego because Don was in the Navy.

They moved back to Washington in 1970 with their two girls and Dianna attended Highline College.

Dianna started working at Washington Horse breeders working on their monthly breeder's magazine where her organization and efficiency were put to quick use. In 1974 Don and Dianna bought a house in Renton where they lived for over 30 years. This is when Dianna started working for the Renton School District. She was a secretary at two different schools where she trained several principals, filled in for the school nurse, and became the school counselor when necessary. March 17, 2021

The Virtual Meeting was called to order at 7:09 PM by Pamela Remley, Region 1 Director. The meeting was attended by 5 delegates and 4 officers, representing 4 clubs. (The meeting was held virtually due to

continued restrictions from the Governor that do not allow for in-person meetings of greater than 5 people.)

There was a virtual Flag Salute; the Pledge of Allegiance; and a moment of silence for the ill and departed.

Guests: None.

Secretary Report: As published in the Tri-Power. Motion made for acceptance and seconded. The motion passed.

Correspondence: None

Directors Report: PNW4WDA Board of Directors Meeting Report: Trail Jamboree registration is open. Lisa Chissus sent an e-mail that the grant for Spill Kits was approved, and this will be available after April 27. OSP T-shirts, only 3 spots for sponsorships on the shirts remain. Monies for this have been sent to the Regions. WOHVA sponsored Class C Chainsaw class being formed. Lisa Chissus has asked for 1 representative from each Region. Kevin V has volunteered for Region 1. Cooper City Deep Creek Waterfall Bridge is of concern in the Naches District. A letter may need to be sent. The Webinar for April will be on the Element Fire Extinguisher by Lakewood Fire Department. See PNW4WDA website to register. Region 7 may have a new club joining them; Steve Zentner is coordinating that. Scholarship winners have been selected for the four \$2000 scholarships; notification of the winners is pending. (None from Region 1; discussion to more effectively announce this through Region 1 for next year.) Diana Williams, long-time member of Region 1 Go4Alls Club passed away March 5. E-mail from Region 4: Challenge from Region 4 to donate to Scholarship Fund in Diana Williams' name; Region 4 has already donated. Discussion for details of Scholarship Fund. Question of whether there is a need to add from clubs for this fund which seems to be well-funded now. This will be taken to the Clubs for discussion among and input from the club members, then will be brought back to the Region 1 Delegates Meeting in April for final vote of delegates. Past Timber Tamer, Duncan Hoke passed away due to Leukemia at age 59 on 3/15/2021.

Treasurer's Report: As distributed with the agendas for this meeting. Essentially unchanged from last month, except for paying for the Region 1 logo on the OSP T-shirts. Despite the report that monies from OSP T-shirt from PNW4WDA have been sent (per the BOD report), that has not yet been received. Pam will follow-up on this. A motion was made and seconded to accept the Treasurer's report. The motion passed.

Land & Legislative: Ed Tenney, South End Representative. Not much new. Small work parties mostly on Fridays led by Mike Kash, primarily to close-off unauthorized bypasses of obstacles. Ben Hale sent request for more E&E help. Discussion was to encourage this to be done—it is mostly just talking with people while at Reiter.
