Washington Executive Report- Lisa Chissus

Spent a week out at Liberty with my Hurtin Unit club and several other volunteers clearing trails. Still some snow when I left so be sure to come prepared.

Two campgrounds in the Cle Elum Ranger District will not be open for Memorial Day weekend. The Wishpoosh Campground will be opening in June to allow time for annual campground maintenance to occur after completing construction of several major improvements at the site including a new vault toilet and improvements to the road, parking lot, and boat launch. Rider's Camp will be closed for the season closed due to an outbreak of mountain pine beetle that has resulted in a substantial number of hazard trees that need to be mitigated prior to opening.

Naches will be closing the Kaner Flats Campground and Longmire sometime in September or October for logging.

Naches Ranger District has materials for us to complete the repairs to the bridges on Naches Trail. Will be looking for some volunteers to come help with that in June as soon as snow melts. Please contact me if you are interested?

Region 1 Report - Pamela Remley

May 19, 2021-Microsoft Teams

The Virtual Meeting was called to order at 7:07 PM by Pamela Remley, Region 1 Director. The meeting was attended by 3 delegates, 3 officers, and 1 guest, representing 3 clubs. (The meeting was held virtually due to continued restrictions from the Governor that do not allow for in-person meetings of greater than 5 people.) There was a virtual Flag Salute; the Pledge of Allegiance; and a moment of silence for the ill and departed.

Guests: Lisa Chissus, Washington State Director.

Secretary Report: As published in the Tri-Power. Motion made for acceptance and seconded. The motion passed.

Correspondence: No correspondence.

Directors Report: From Lisa and Pam, the PNW4WDA Board Meeting on June 5, 2021, will be at the All-America Car Museum in Tacoma. It will open at 8:30 AM for Board Members, and the meeting will be at 10:00 AM for Board Members and guests. (Entry for the Board Members is covered, but non-Board Members will be subject to the entry fee.) Parking is \$5. The restaurant is not currently open due to Covid restrictions, and the catered meals are \$40, so packing a lunch is probably more economical. Reservations to attend this meeting are also required. Region 4 has events going on as printed in the Tri-Power. Naches is open on the east side, but not the west. The Umtanum area is generally open. The

Liberty area is currently being cleaned-up as they do annually. The finishing touches for the 2 bridges to Government Meadows have the materials but are waiting to coordinate with the Forest Service to complete the project. (Perhaps June?)

Treasurer's Report: Profit & Loss statement shows a total of \$0.12 of interest accrued since last month. Received the \$500 check from Dave McMains for OSP. Received and deposited \$200 from Dirty 13 for the Trails Fund. No other activity in the accounts.

Land & Legislative: North End Representative, Kevin is not present; report is from Casey who attended the meeting. The government is updating the Walker Valley maps. Input emphasized need to include and name the gatekeepers on the maps. Discussion on standard term for the gatekeepers ("Gatekeepers", "Qualifiers", and "Authorized Go-Arounds" all have been suggested) as well as giving identifiable names for the different gatekeepers. Discussed that it's important to identify them with names that can be easily recognized by users new to the area (e.g.: "South" Authorized Go-Around" rather than "Shoo-Fly Gate" or "Middle Gate"). Also discussed importance of signage for these authorized gatekeepers. Also noted that other gates (such as near Cavanaugh Lake) do NOT have Authorized Go-Arounds. Discussed that the north gatekeeper (near the Rock-Hound Parking Area) is very difficult for longer wheel-based vehicles to get through, and there is an issue that it's more difficult to get through (either to enter or exit) than the obstacles on the trails—and it's a LONG way back to the south gatekeeper near the Timber Tamer Trails via the trails. DNR is considering installing an additional gatekeeper higher on the trails (like on the Mainline Trail) to discourage users from getting as far as the north gatekeeper so that it's not so difficult to go back to the south gatekeeper at the end of the day when the users are tired. DNR would prefer not to alter the north gatekeeper to make it easier. DNR has evaluated the big rock on Ron's Run, and now has it on their list to make an authorized go-around for that obstacle to try to avoid erosion and deterioration of the surrounding soils. The post regarding the purpose of Gatekeepers/Qualifiers/Go-Arounds at Walker Valley on the Walker Valley Facebook site has been VERY well received—viewed more than 33,000 times and shared more than 115 times. Jim Cahill requested that postings for work parties be suspended for now, as no organized work parties are currently being done due to Covid restrictions—but people are showing up for them. He anticipates they will be able to resume in the autumn. South End Representative, Ed is not present; report is from Casey and Pam. Unofficial work parties are still happening with Mike "Krash" Kash. No official work parties. Lisa asked what Reiter did to clean-up the issues and abuses from Reiter Pit in the past—Region 2 has raised the issue that Elbe is suffering some similar problems as Reiter Pit had in the past. Much discussion ensued, especially specifying that the current Reiter Foothills ORV Area is NOT the same area as the Reiter Pit; jurisdictions and ownership of the two areas are very different. Also, the gate at Reiter is locked when the area is not open—no go-arounds—and that it's not accessible when the area is not open. The people who were involved with the changes at Reiter from the PNW4WDA club standpoint aren't really around anymore, and it was suggested

that Region 2 contact DNR officials from Reiter to ask them what was done. Legislation: No big local updates, but there is a need to write our representatives to encourage federal funding of trails across the country. Angie requests that even trail work forms for E&E and M&O be sent to her to help report that this work is being done. Please send copies of any letters or e-mails sent to state senators and representatives also be copied (or "CC'd) to her for the Quill Power reports so we can keep track of what legislative measures are being addressed.

Featured Club: Timber Tamers sponsored the meeting tonight. It's one of the larger clubs in the region. There is a wide variety of interests, from rock-crawling to scenic runs to destination runs. It was founded on May 4, 1979, and became a 501c3 corporation in 2012.

Region Report: Bullshifters: no report. Dirty 13: Since the last meeting, they did a run at Sugarloaf near Leavenworth. They were going to go to Riders Camp, but that is closed for the season due to fall risk of trees from bark beetle damage. They are planning to do the Idaho BCDR departing June 26, going from south to north, and seeing how far they can get in a week. Still about 10 members. Doo Wop Ditty: no report. Happy Campers: no report. Off Road Express: no report. Outdoor 4x4: no report. Rainer Ridge Rams: Had a socially-distanced hybrid in-person/virtual meeting. Planning a possible club run to Tahuya. Still working on planning Trail Jamboree. Timber Tamers: Meetings still virtual. The Welcome Run at Walker Valley last month was complicated by investing time helping with a victim of a motorcycle crash on the Lower Timber Tamer Trail. Planning to run the Green Dot Road near Vantage this Saturday. Wandering Willys: no report. Washington Bobtails: no report.

Action List Follow-Up: Gatekeeper Names at Walker Valley: Update addressed above in the North End report under Land & Legislative. Broken Links on the PNW Website: Curt reports some progress was made, but it will likely take more action and interest from the PNW4WDA BOD to make more extensive updates. It was discussed that this may be an impediment for potential new younger members who largely communicate via on-line venues. It seems there may be a perception that the PNW4WDA is an organization of older 4-wheeling enthusiasts who communicate more via snail-mail communication than by on-line communication. It is felt that we can be more effective advocates for our sport if we can all work together. Check to Dave McMains for the Diana Williams Memorial: Check was sent per Casey. Information for memorials: Pam attended the Diana Williams memorial—it was very good, about 300 people. The Duncan Hoke memorial was on-line and was nice. Ideas for OSP T-Shirt money: None of the delegates present this evening had been able to discuss with their clubs for ideas. This issue was tabled for this month and will be addressed again next month. Delegates are again urged to discuss this with their clubs to bring back suggestions of how to use this money.

Old Business: Metal Plaques: Ed is not present, thus unable to provide an update. June Delegates Meeting at Alfy's Pizza (9620 19th Ave SE, Everett, WA 98208). Casey will contact Ted at Alfy's to see if we can make this happen. Trail Jamboree: We have the permit to hold the event! Registration is full, but a waiting-list is being taken. It's not uncommon for people to have vehicle breakage that cancels their attendance at Trail Jamboree, so it's still good to go on the waiting list if someone wants to go. Sponsors can send the registration fees to Dave McMains. There is still availability for one more Sponsor. Need sign-ups for Camp Hosts at Jim Sprick Park; look for this on the Trail Jam website, accessible through the PNW4WDA website. (Camp Hosts help at the camp; although they don't go on the trails during Trail Jam, they can go on trails in the pre-running before Trail Jam officially starts.) Reiter Rock Crawl: Still tentatively 7/17/2021. The final decision on whether this will happen will be made at tomorrow evening's Timber Tamer meeting, however it's not looking too hopeful at this point due to the Covid restrictions. At this point, a permit has not yet been issued.

Operation Shore Patrol: Casey reports she has not been able to get images of the T-Shirts and notes it's difficult to peddle them without some visual representation of them! Pam said she thinks that since Kyle has completed work on the Competition T-Shirts, he should have bandwidth now to work on the OSP T-Shirts. It's still unclear how the money for the T-Shirts will be divvied-up; Pam will try to get clarification of this. There was discussion of pricing for tickets for the raffle. Consensus was that although the tickets for the general raffle will be \$1, the tickets for the bench Casey is making should be \$5. Contact Dave at the Tidelands Campground (360-289-8963) to make camping reservations.

New Business: The PNW4WDA Board Meeting will be June 5 as described above in the Director's Report.

Good of the Order: No report.

Action Items: John will include the message that work parties are suspended until further notice due to Covid restrictions in listings of upcoming events in the Region 1 minutes and agendas. We will skip the usual raffle at the upcoming hybrid Region 1 Delegates Meeting in June. Delegates are to discuss ideas for use of the OSP Shirt money for promotional items and to bring back those ideas to the June Region 1 meeting.

Dear PNW,


I am currently an Engineering Student at Pierce College.



Hello, my name is Alex Ross and I am a current student at the University of Washington. Because of circumstances beyond my control, my family and myself have undergone a significant change in financial status as of late. Unfortunately, during my first quarter last fall, the week before finals, I was involved in a car rollover off of I-5 on November 27th, 2018. I sustained some mild injuries, but serious enough to keep me out of school for several weeks. Being that I was in a rollover, I was diagnosed with a mild concussion and severe whiplash. There was no way I could come to class in the coming days after and I had to file a hardship withdrawal and could not work for the coming weeks after. 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
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
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
