Region 1 Report - Pamela Remley

August 19, 2021

The Virtual Meeting was called to order at 7:10 PM by Pamela Remley, Region 1 Director. The meeting was attended by 5 delegates, 4 officers, and 1 guest, representing 3 clubs. (The meeting was held as a virtual meeting due to restrictions from the Governor that restrict in-person meetings.) There was a virtual Flag Salute and a moment of silence for the ill and departed.

Guests: Nichol Phillips, Tri-Power Editor, and PR officer for PNW4WDA.

Secretary Report: As published in the Tri-Power. Motion made for acceptance and seconded. The motion passed.

Correspondence: None.

Directors Report: Not much new. September 11, 2021, will be the Fall Delegates Meeting in Longview, WA. Please check the PNW4WDA website for details.

Treasurer's Report: We had \$0.39 of interest income for the month. The only expenditure for the month was for the new banner that was ordered. There are significant upcoming expenditures for OSP.

Land & Legislative: North End Representative: Both Jim and Ryan have been allocated to wildfire management in eastern Washington; due to these wildfires as well as continued COVID

restrictions, there was no Walker Valley meeting this month. It is not expected that meetings will resume until October. South End Representative: As with Walker Valley, there was no Reiter Foothills meeting due to staff being reallocated to wildfire management in eastern Washington as well as continued COVID restrictions. Legislation: No update.

Competition: Joe May (Competition Representative) is not present. Nichol reports that Summer Convention competition will be very soon. Races were held to benefit the Parker Family, who have new twins with significant congenital challenges. \$67,000 was raised at these races, and it was noted that this came from more than just the “race family”. Everyone expressed pride in how the PNW4WDA community has pulled together to support our own!

Please send copies of any letters or e-mails sent to state senators and representatives also be copied (or “CC’d) to her for the Quill Power reports so we can keep track of what legislative measures are being addressed.

Membership: No report.

PR: No report.

Featured Club: The Bullshifters hosted the meeting tonight. No representative was present to report on their club.

Region Report: Bullshifters: no report. Dirty 13: Again noted the Idaho Backcountry Discovery Route discussed last month; 1576 miles, 2 broken axles, and 4 driveline breaks on the trip! Also have done trails in central Oregon. In 30 days they’ve wheeled 20 days! None just recently due to wildfire threats. Doo Wop Ditty: no report. Happy Campers: no report. Off Road Express: no report. Outdoor 4x4: no report. Rainer Ridge Rams: “A whole lot of nothing” recently, due mostly to wildfire issues. Timber Tamers: Meetings have remained virtual due to COVID issues. 4 vehicles participated in the Idaho Jeep Jamborees USA trip. Several members took a wheeling trip through Idaho and Montana—and traveled over 2600 miles doing several trail runs. There were several non-catastrophic breaks, and the high temp was 114F! Wandering Willys: no report. Washington Bobtails: no report.

Action List Follow-Up: Sponsorship for Tight & Twisty Trail at Reiter. Tabled until October.

OSP T-shirts: Casey got in touch with Kyle. ALL ORDERS MUST BE SUBMITTED TO CASEY BY 8/25/2021!! After discussion, Casey will order extra T-shirts for OSP; 5 L and 20 XL. 50th Year OSP Give-Away. Dash plaques discussed last month fell through, but Casey was able to get a much better price from Trails Conquered for medallions; this was discussed, and these will be distributed 1 medallion for each vehicle. Also, stickers will be ordered and will be more easily distributed than the medallions; more of these can very easily be ordered if needed. New Region 1 Banner: Casey got this ordered just after the last meeting—before the old banner was picked up by John. However, it won't be bad to have 2 banners.

Old Business: Metal Plaques: Ed was not present, so was not able to report on this. Operation Shore Patrol: There is still \$250 available for large raffle items. During the discussion, Carl noted that for about \$200 he can get a Stihl Chainsaw in a size good for trail work. He will look into this and get back in touch with Casey. Soft Shackles were suggested as other items that can be acquired to use the remaining funds after a chain saw. Other raffle items have been received from Bubba Rope and Warn. Casey re-emphasized that ALL CLOTHING ORDERS MUST BE SUBMITTED BY 8/25/2021, AND ALL ORDERS FOR THE STEAK DINNER MUST BE SUBMITTED NO LATER THAN 9/12/2021!! NWJeepcast All Jeep Show: Went well. A good number of people to help at the PNW4WDA/Region 1/Timber Tamer's booth, and lots of people stopped by. The DNR booth referred people to our booth when they asked about clubs or places to wheel. We also had a number of people from outside of Region 1 who stopped by asking about clubs—they were referred to the Region 2 and Region 4 Directors as well as the PNW4WDA website for further information to get connected with clubs near where they live. There was a demonstration competition stock-class and Ultra4-class short-course that was run—and was a lot of fun! Also, a very large raffle. There was a huge Show-N-Shine with about 300 Jeeps present. All in all, a success!

New Business: None.

Good of the Order: Casey met with Luke and picked up several raffle items as well as additional raffle tickets. John met with Dave Taylor and got 6 boxes of old records (dating back to at least 1976!!) along with a plastic container of other items—and “The Briefcase”. He will be going through this material to catalog it and report back here to decide what can be kept and what may be better disposed of. Curt reported that he has met several people who live east of the Cascades and referred them to the Region 4 website, but then noted that the Region 4 website still has a number of broken and dead links to clubs. Pam and Nichol said they would mention this at the PNW4WDA Director's meeting as well as possibly the Fall Delegates Meeting to ask for this to be updated.

August 26, 2021

The meeting was called to order in person by Director Jessica Bailey at 7:30 pm. The flag salute was recited followed by a moment of silence for our dearly departed.

Secretary's Report – Minutes were submitted to Tri-Power by Jessica. This is still an OPEN position! The motion was made by Brandon Marek and seconded by Connie Largen to accept minutes as printed, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report – We still have money! Printed reports were supplied. If you'd like details on the amounts please reach out. Motion made by Connie Largen and seconded by Derrick Clark to accept the treasurer's report as printed, motion passed.

Naches – Work party last month. Had a great turnout, about 40 people showed up. They filled in some of the huge mud holes off to the side and used 80 +/- yards of rock to fill them. Naches trail doesn't have all the little cutouts anymore it is back to mostly the original Naches trail.

Forest service brought equipment and helped also. Also did some minor bridge

repairs/maintenance. A lot of stuff was done for one day! Thanks to everyone who made it out to help.

Evans Creek – Still open for use. WOHVA has been up there doing a lot of work but ran out of funding for the moment so are waiting on that. Lots of water bars for drainage were added.

Elbe Hills – The new campground is open for use. Please contact Adin Simmons for reservations, and plan a month or more out. Most holiday weekends are first come first serve. August's work party was canceled due to potential fire danger. At the September 11th work party they will hopefully be installing a second shelter. The next Focus Group Meeting is September 9th, via Zoom.

Tahuya – Still doing newbie runs. Side note, they did a run-up to Sadie Creek recently and most of the trails are closed to do loggings right now.

Land Matters – Brandon Marek forgot to bring his bylaw proposal to remove this position from the region, he says he will bring it next month for us to vote on.

Letter Writing – There have been some emails going out of support – email counts as letter writing! If you send support emails in just CC Angie Marek.

Membership – No report.

Ways & Means – No report.

Public Relations – Nichol Phillips is trying to promote all events for the year everywhere she can, make sure to let her know about your event so she can help spread the word. Angie would like to say Nichol does an AMAZING job and wants to thank her. Don't be afraid to share posts also on Facebook, screenshot and send to friends, etc.

Future 4 Wheelers – This is still an open position.

Competition – Last race for the year is Overbored's Labor Day race at Ethel. The Parker Family Fundraiser brought the grand total raised this year for the family to just shy of \$70,000. Thanks to everyone who made it possible to help such a deserving family! You are all truly appreciated. The second round of nominations for Region 2 Comp Chairman were opened. Brandon Marek nominated Nathan Linderkamp at the last meeting. James McColeman nominates Todd Trummert for the position. There were no other nominations for this month. Nominations will be opened one more time at the September meeting then voted on.

Old Business – Operation Shore Patrol Update: Jessica Bailey has been working on securing dumpsters, we always have them donated so she is reaching out to LeMay and if there is no reply then will try another company. Lisa mentioned maybe having West Coast Savers will leave theirs for an extra week since their cleanup is the weekend before ours? She is going to check. If they aren't going to donate them then we will have to have the region pay for the cost of dumpsters and order them. Brandon Marek makes a motion to pay for dumpsters if we aren't able to get them donated, Carey Taylor seconds, motion passed. Jessica is also in contact with

the Chamber of Commerce Director and the chili feed is a go, but she's waiting for a response about the parade. We still need to spend \$500 funds somewhere to make the event great. Angie mentioned maybe some of those silicone cups we had at Winter Convention a couple of years ago, people seemed to love them. Jessica will try to see about getting them for the event, but if they're too expensive will find another option and get them ordered ASAP. Brandon Marek makes a motion to buy cups, Nathan Linderkamp seconds, motion passed. If the silicone cups can't be done in time or for the price board can make the decision to change to something else. Quite a few campsites are still available, and you have until Sept 1st to reserve them. Jessica asked if we want the region to order extra hoodies/shirts to sell at the event? Angie suggested 2-3 dozen popular sizes (L/XL/2XL) of hoodies and t-shirts. The region does make a profit so we don't lose money on it. Rob Stafford makes a motion to order 3 dozen t-shirts and hoodies, Derrick Clark seconds, passed.

These were bought with an education grant, so give them out as an education and how to use trails properly.

August 10, 2021-Zoom

Called to Order: Meeting called to order at 7:00 p.m. followed by a flag salute and a request for prayers for those dearly departed.

Sande Nettnin motioned to accept minutes as posted, Earl Nettnin seconded. Motion passed.

Secretary's Report: None

Treasurer's Report verbal only: Monthly Zoom bill to be paid. Blue Ribbon Coalition sent thank you letter for \$100 donation. Peggy Thomas as purchased the t-shirts for PUAM. A receipt is required for reimbursement.

Club Power/We Did it: No report

Land Matters: Lisa Chissus reported there were two senators (one democrat and one republican) who submitted an amendment (2616) to increase funding for Recreational Trails Program (RTP). It was also reported by Ron Rutherford that the Naches Ranger District has ordered an attachment for their large that will dimensional lumber from logs.

4x4 trails closed due to fires at this time are the 1500 Road (Rattlesnake Ridge, 1600 Road (Clover Springs Road) 1700 Road, which is across from Jim Sprick Campground, and 1800 Road, which goes into Copper City. Skip Frans will contact Jerry Ford regarding PUAM planned mid-September.

Ron Rutherford spoke with his contact at Helleisen Lumber & Supply Company regarding materials which when ordered will be three weeks out.

Sande Nettnin stated the PNW has at least \$5,000 in the trail maintenance fund and our new silver sponsor, NW Jeep Cast, has donated \$1,500 of which \$750 is to go into the trail maintenance fund and \$750 is to go into the general fund.

Jerry Ford, Resource Assistant for Nachees Ranger District, would like TWIG meetings to start back up, but it seems they are always turned down by Wenatchee.

Competition: A benefit race was held last weekend which raised \$67,000 for their family in need In two weeks (August 22) summer convention will be held in Ethel, WA. Great prizes will be given for their best "Comp Theme"

A unanimous vote was held to nominate Mike Julsrud the Region 4 Comp Chair for 2022.

Old Business: A trip to Arctic Circle is being planned for June 2022. Please contact Jack Anderson, of Trail Seekers, for more information.

New Business: Lisa Chissus has requested not to use the Forest Service fund en route or Region 4 funds this year to repair the Government Meadows bridge and to wait until next year. Peggy Thomas reported on PUAM. The t-shirts have been ordered without Region 4 or PNW on them, but she will call to see if the order can be changed. She further reported that due to Covid-19 and/or Delta, paper products may be difficult to get due to warehouses and distribution centers being closed down.

Skip Frans announced he has priced meat and is planning to purchase about 50 pounds of meat (1/2 pound per person for 100 people) and will work with Les Thomas to get the meat prepared for the event.

Nichol Phillips reminded everyone that the Fall Delegates meeting will be held on September 11.

Lisa Chissus reported that Leah Dobey, the contact for all DNR users in RCO has accepted a new position. Her replacement has not been announced. Once her replacement is announced Lisa will introduce herself.

Lisa Chissus announced the WA State Coalition will be held on October 28 at the Bright Water Environmental Education & Community Center in Woodinville, WA.

Lisa Chissus explained that in order to receive grant money from the government many tasks and forms must be completed. We are currently waiting on one last approval to receive our final blessing. Our grant money will be based on reimbursement of money spent since July 1st.
