This decision was not made lightly. We want to make sure that we as an association adhere to the plan set forth by the Governor of Washington. The size of our group means that we cannot say for certain we would be allowed to have our event, so we have decided to postpone. We will immediately start working on our 2021 event to make sure it is bigger and better than ever. I want to thank everyone that has put forth so much effort for this year and ask that you remain on board to be a large part of 2021 Trail Jamboree. With that being said there are two options we are offering: 1) the option to roll your entry over automatically to 2021. You will be locked in for registration at the 2020 rate. If there is an increase in 2021 you will not be charged the difference. We will also have a special gift for you when you come to the event in 2021 for rolling over your 2020 registration. If you wish to choose this option, please contact registration prior to May 25th. 2) you have the option for a full refund. If we do not hear from you by May 25th, we will automatically issue you a refund and you will need to re-register for 2021 when registration opens. I want to thank everyone for their commitment and dedication to staying safe and healthy. I would also like to invite everyone to plan for and partake in our service events Pick Up A Mountain and Operation Shore Patrol that is on schedule for September. We could always use the help and support at these events and would love to see you all there. Thanks again for your support and understanding. This too will be a memory in the not so distant future. Emergency Board Meeting Regarding Trail Jamboree- Sande Nettnin

Emergency Board meeting

May 5, 2020

PNW President Kyle Wiebold (Push & Pulls, Our Gang Offroad, Sand Fleas, and RPM Racing) called the Emergency Board meeting held on Zoom to order at 7:15 PM. The purpose of this special meeting was to discuss what we wanted to do about having Trail Jamboree this year due to the COVID-19 Virus restrictions detailed in Governor Inslee's Safe Start Plan for Washington State, a 4 phase approach to opening our state. Much discussion was held on if we should cancel it or not. With the plans the governor has in place, it really doesn't look like we would be able to have a gathering of the number of people who attend Trail Jamboree by July. At this time, we really don't have a lot of funds invested yet. A motion was made by Region 7 Director Jeff Williams (Spokane 4-Wheelers) seconded by Region 4 Director Skip Frans (Trail Seekers) that we notify everyone who is registered and offer them the opportunity to roll over their registration to July 2021 with no increase in price if the cost should go up. They will have until Memorial Day to let us know if they wanted to roll it over to July 2021. If we don't hear from them by that date, they will be getting a full refund. More discussion followed and an amendment to the motion will say if they roll their registration over to 2021, they will receive \$20 in raffle tickets when they arrive at the park. Only the elected board voted; motion carried. We are not happy to have to make this decision, but we feel it's in the best interest of everyone that we try to keep everyone safe.

Kyle will write the letter and suggest that they might want to attend Pick Up A Mountain or Operation Shore Patrol in September if we are able to hold these events. Kyle will have it posted on Facebook as well as the Web site and in Tri-Power.

Our 5-year permit for Trail Jamboree expires at the end of July. We need to start working on a new 5-year permit as it sometimes takes several months to get one.

The meeting adjourned at 7:50 PM.

RCO Board Meeting

I listened to the RCO Board meeting on April 21, 2020. Here are some of the highlights. This was their first virtual meeting and they had over 50 participants. (more than double of what they usually have)

They agreed to extend the grant applications WWRP to July 1. So far, the NOVA and RTP grant applications are still due on November 1, 2020.

They authorized the RCO Director to have more autonomy for existing grants. However, Kaleen did caution that she would not easily be persuaded for additional funds due to the current budget crisis. They had a picture of Jeeps in Elbe as part of this presentation which was nice to see them highlight one of our OHV projects! It was also encouraging that Kaleen said that when we had a budget crisis back in 2008 the state continues to support outdoor recreation since it is considered an economic stimulus, so it is unlikely that they would see it differently during this time.


The forest will always be a huge part of my life. I am so glad to be a member of the PNW4WDA.

Unfortunately, during my first quarter last fall, the week before finals, I was involved in a car rollover off of I-5 on November 27th, 2018. I sustained some mild injuries, but serious enough to keep me out of school for several weeks. Being that I was in a rollover, I was diagnosed with a mild concussion and severe whiplash. There was no way I could come to class in the coming days after and I had to file a hardship withdrawal and could not work for the coming weeks after. Dear PNW,


I am currently an Engineering Student at Pierce College.

1) Willamette National Forest closes Breitenbush (FSR 46) and McCoy Creek (FSR2233) Roads.

This statement was dated Mar 28, 2020

We have temporarily closed all developed recreation sites to provide for the protection of public health and safety and prevent the spread of COVID-19. The closed sites include campgrounds, day-use sites, trailheads with bathrooms, Sno-Parks, snow shelters, fire lookouts, hot springs, boat launch facilities, and OHV trailhead facilities.

We are working to connect and serve the public virtually using websites, emails, and telephone calls.
