Region 2 Delegates Meeting

July 18, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 7:30pm by Director Brandon Marek, followed by the flag salute and a moment of silence.

Secretary's report: Minutes from last month are printed and available to grab. Connie Largen makes a motion to accept the minutes as printed, Derrick Clark seconds, motion passed.

Treasurer's report: Connie Largen makes a motion to accept the treasurer's report, Derrick Clark seconds, motion passed.

We Did It/Club Power: Forms still available online, if you need help finding them just ask.

Naches: Work party up there recently, good turnout. About 40 people on Saturday & 30 on Sunday. Lots of rock hauled in but lots to still do, next summer's work party is going to need trail capable trailers to haul more in.

Evans Creek: The work party had a good turnout, about 60-70 volunteers showed up. The Rednecks & Rugrats fun run was great! It rained a lot week before but the rock that's been hauled in previously paid off and held the trail together nicely.

Elbe Hills: Brandon and I attended the Focus Group Meeting last Thursday. At this meeting we discussed some of the maintenance to be done at the work party, met one of the new employees, discussed some future grant funding we will be getting, and talked about the finalized campground plan. If anyone would like to see copies of the campground plans or grant information just let me know and I can send it over. We also attended the July work party this past weekend (hosted by a group called Watch This Fourwheelerz) and it was a fantastic turnout. There was a total of 107 signed in volunteers! We got lots of water bars dug and illegal bypasses closed on several trails, trash cleaned up everywhere, and some other maintenance on the Busywild with adding in some smaller rock to fill in bad spots. They also worked on the boat ramp some more, adding more rock to the crawl coming up to the base of the obstacle. They hosted a chili dog lunch midday, as well as a great raffle after the day was ending.

Tahuya: At the last Newbie Run there was a lot of new faces, some that were even first time jeepers. Lots of fun, went well. Mud lake has no water right now, so it's the best time to come out is to see what is normally underwater.

Land Matters: Still nobody in this position. PLEASE take it back to your clubs and help us find someone to take this on, it is a critical position that needs someone dedicated to keeping us informed! Brandon got a phone call, hopefully we will have more info soon. Someone who owns part of the property that leads to Surprise Lake (Carbanado/Wilkeson area) is very unhappy. Users are causing damage to the land and they are talking about putting in a gate and making it so that it cannot be used like this. The owner is an avid outdoorsman and feels bad about closing it off but is trying to figure out a way to still let people who are responsible have access. The landowner is going to call back when he is back in town from Alaska. Will update everyone as soon as possible.

Letter Writing: No report.

Membership: There is a club planning on trying to come back to the association, The Wild Bunch. They have turned in paperwork to Kristin but didn't get a response before the meeting. They came here to talk a little and introduce themselves. They're restarting the club; it was originally started in the 70's. Attended lot of the events back in the day and contributed a lot. The next generation of their families are now getting into everything and want to get back into the PNW and have some fun with us all.

Ways & Means: Tiffany Morris will be at Summer Convention with the trailer. There is lots of new stuff, she sold out of a lot of stuff at Trail Jam and is ordering more. Cleared out a lot of older stuff at Swap Meet.

Dash plaques have been ordered through the Lineup again, the total for 100 of them came to \$109.90. I have an invoice and need a check to take back to them to pay for the order.

I still have lots of raffle prizes rolling in regularly! If anyone's club is donating, please let me know so I can make sure you get thanked on the event page as well as get your name on the sponsors list that I'll be printing and posting up at the run!

Billy Bob's Offroad has offered to pay for all the food for the run so that the Region doesn't have to foot the bill like in years past, so long as someone else is still serving.

All stations are covered. Lara Jungmayer will be at registration along with Brandon & Angie Marek, and Duane Klusman offered to help for a while till he hits the trail. I need two people that can be dedicated to only selling tickets. I'll be getting there Wednesday night. If anyone will be up there early, I'll be stuffing the gate bags at my motorhome Thursday afternoon.

Old business: OSP - Lisa Chissus has been working on trying to connect the regions together like in the past, and now there's flyers available with all the different ones on it. There is also another cleanup going on by Coastal Savers at multiple locations at the same time, she's trying to coordinate so that we don't double up on the same areas. Region 2 reservations/clothing order still open, the website should be fully functional by this weekend. Shirts and hoodies available, but if you want a quarter zip call Joy for one as they're not being openly offered. If you don't book through them but you want to stay at the campground and it's after the 2nd week of August, they will just put you wherever. Length restriction is 50', but there is a place to park trailers. Also be aware that "aggressive breed dogs" will be turned away immediately and not allowed on the premises at all. Please find a dog sitter and leave them at home.

Trail Jam - Sounds like it went well. Two trainers from the International 4WD Association and taught a couple of seminars. Hosted a 101 class on the trail and it was awesome, they're planning on coming back next year. Next year's trail host assignments will be done by the end of this month. They'll know what trails they are

running next year. There were requests to swap hosts around to do different trails, so we are shaking things up. Pretty much everyone from this year has already committed to next year, and Military Jeepers offered to be a backup trail host.

New business: There are new "Who and What We Are" brochures, Brandon has some available if anyone wants a few to hand out.

Opening first round of nominations for Region 2 Comp Chairman. Butch Danielson nominates Nathan Linderkamp from Renegade Offroad for the position, Nathan accepts. Nominations closed for July.

Motion made to use the sign in sheet as roll call, passed.

Announcements: Fun in the Sun Offroad Show July 20th.

Dave Shimek belongs to a group called 253 UTV, and on Saturday Aug 10th they are hosting a show & shine. All proceeds go to Mary Bridge. From 10-3 at the Lemay Museum in Tacoma. CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAW PROPOSAL FORM

ARTICLE SECTION

(Title: Re: ARTICLE V OFFICER)

Constitution/By-Law presently reads:

Section 6

Terms of office shall be for one (1) year and there shall be no limit to the number of terms an officer may succeed himself in office as long as he remains a member in good standing in his club and he has been nominated and elected. The officers will have no vote at delegates meetings except the President in the case of a tie. EXCEPTIION; Officers with current competition and safety related bylaws and rules.

Proposed Constitution/By-Law amendment to read:

Section 6

Terms of office shall be for two (2) years and there shall be no limit to the number of terms an officer may succeed himself in office as long as he remains a member in good standing in his club and he has been nominated and elected. The officers will have no vote at delegates meetings except the President in the case of a tie. EXCEPTIION; Officers with current competition and safety related bylaws and rules.

INTENT Eliminate the need to elect officers every year.


