You will need a \$5 Christmas tree permit to remove a tree from the Okanogan-Wenatchee National Forest. Permits can be purchased at numerous businesses in Okanogan, Chelan, Kittitas, and Yakima Counties. Permits can also be purchased online. See links below. Permits are not refundable.

Free Christmas Tree Permits are available to all Fourth Graders with Every Kid Outdoors Pass or voucher. Pass holders may receive a free Christmas tree permit by presenting Every Kid Outdoors Pass or valid paper voucher printed from the Every Kid Outdoors website: everykidoutdoors.gov (https://everykidoutdoors.gov/)

The maximum tree size is 15 feet.

The tree may be cut or dug up and removed as a transplant. The ground starts freezing as early as November. Please fill in the hole created when digging up a live tree.

Please remove the entire tree, not just the top. Leave no more than a 6-inch stump.

If there are any live limbs still attached to the stump after the tree is felled, cut them from the stump.

When at a trailhead requiring a fee, you will need to display a Northwest Forest Pass on the dashboard of the vehicle. This can be purchased from any Forest Service office.

Do not park at a Sno-Park unless you have a valid Washington State Sno-Park permit displayed in your vehicle.

When choosing a Christmas tree, try to pick a tree from among a group of trees so one area does not become void of trees.

The Christmas tree permit system is not meant to be a replacement for our special forest product transplant program. That program is separate from its own guidelines. The Christmas tree program is just that, a program set up for families to cut their own Christmas tree.

When you cut your tree, peel and attach the Christmas tree permit sticker by wrapping it around the tree trunk between limbs where it is clearly visible while in transit. Tags may not be re-used.

Permits cost \$10 each for a tree up to 15 feet. The permits are non-refundable. The supply of permits at all locations is limited. Once the supply is exhausted, no more permits will be available, so it is advised to call and verify their availability ahead of time.

Proposal to add line 8. – Super Legends Class. Any driver 70 years or older is eligible.

One Under the Hill Gang class. Any qualifying licensed competitor ages 16 – 25. No wheelbase breakdown. No cylinder breakdown.

Proposed rule to be added in competition section where applicable

Comp vehicles to have a main power disconnect switch to be located on the outside of the vehicle in a visible spot. Recommended location on the left rear of the vehicle.

Intention:

If the rig is rolled over or crashed and the driver is incapacitated or unable to shut it down, track personnel can kill the vehicle without putting themselves in harm's way.

I know quite a few rigs have their batteries mounted on the front now. I can completely understand that for this to get traction, we would have to be lenient and allow for disconnects to be located on the front.

Section 4 – Team Relay

Rule to be installed where applicable.

I propose the removal of the club challenge team relay from Summer Convention in lieu of King & Queen/Prince & Princess elimination obstacle or other suitable replacement events.

This proposal does not apply to the traditional Region Relay Challenge only to Club Challenge. Intention:

First, to properly staff a relay course according to the current PNW4WDA rule book is 29 bodies. This does not allow for the substitution of said bodies that wish to compete as well, that number could easily double over the course of the day.

Second, relay makes no provisions for the inclusion of our child competitors at Summer Convention. Due to the typically larger number of competitors at Summer Convention, & the standard slow start that comes with getting relay underway, I do not believe the simple inclusion of the children would be a practical solution. The course used for the Region Challenge could be used with only minor adjustments for gates.

## Region 1 Report - Pamela Remley

November 17, 2021

The Virtual Meeting was called to order at 7:06 PM by Pamela Remley, Region 1 Director. The meeting was attended by 5 delegates and, 3 officers, representing 4 clubs. (The meeting was held as a virtual meeting due to restrictions from the Governor that restrict in-person meetings.) There was a virtual Flag Salute and a moment of silence for the ill and departed. Jessica Bailey noted a member of Region 2 is hospitalized with COVID.

Guests: Jessica Bailey, Director of Region 2. Anna Baklund, the Program Manager of WA/OR for Tread Lightly!, was planning to join us this evening, but a last-minute conflict prevented her from joining us this evening.

Secretary Report: As published in the Tri-Power. Motion made for acceptance and seconded. The motion passed.

Correspondence: Sande Nettin, Association Secretary, has asked for a Region Report prior to the December Directors meeting. Pam is putting this together.

Directors Report: No new updates this month. Pam noted that the Winter Convention is planned for February 11-13, 2022, in Vancouver, but a venue is still not identified.

Treasurer's Report: Please ask for information.

Land & Legislative: North End Representative: Reported by Casey as Kevin was not able to attend the meeting. There is a camping limit of 10 days, likely to change to 7 days. There is no camping at trailheads, but enforcement has been a challenge given the governor's ban on relocating "unhoused persons". There is a new E&E Grant that started on November 1. There are still no official work parties due to COVID restrictions, but if a group wants to do a work project, this can be arranged by contacting Jim Cahill. Timber Sales are coming up, and there was an opportunity for some input from users; the main project is near Humps & Bumps where the timber company likely will also be able to help with a water management problem in that area. However, Timber Sales have up to 3 years to actually perform their harvest. The new play area is still awaiting some authorization. Ryan Rettinghouse is moving to Montana and will no longer be with DNR. (He's done a great job, and we will miss him!!) South End Representative: Ed reported that there is some potential work planned for the single track and quad area. Krash did some work in the Yellow Area. There are still no inperson meetings. Ben is still backfilling in Olympia, so issues for Reiter Foothills should be directed to John Moon, who is covering while Ben is redeployed. Of importance, the grant for E&E did not go through, so the only volunteer hours that will be accepted are M&O hours. Legislation: Ed reported that WOHVA will become a 501c3 corporation, which will limit their ability to directly lobby government entities. They think it won't affect things too much, however. There has been a lot of controversy regarding E-bikes and SXSs; these are not officially

Competition: Joe May (Competition Representative) is not present. Jessica noted that recommended bylaws updates have been distributed by Steve Zentner and will be voted upon at Winter Convention. Most of the changes pertain to clarifying "gray zones" in the current competition rules.

Region Report: Bullshifters: no report. Dirty 13: no report; there have been no meetings for the past 2 months. Doo Wop Ditty: not much new, per Jessica. Happy Campers: no report. Off Road Express: no report. Outdoor 4x4: no report. Rainer Ridge Rams: a fair bit of work happened in the past few days due to the flooding in Whatcom County. One member who is between houses had his vehicle flooded. Members have participated with SAR—some of the rescues were harrowing. Timber Tamers: Held a Welcome Run for newer members last month at Walker; this was successful! Also, a small run last weekend to Reiter. Wandering Willys: no report. Washington Bobtails: no report.

Action List Follow-Up: Ed stated that there is nothing new since last month, but he'll contact Jim Cahill to discuss the questions of posting the trail work plaques.

Old Business: Nominations for 2022 officers: Director: John was nominated last month, he tentatively accepted, but stated he could not do both Secretary and Director roles. There were no other new nominations this month. Vice Director: Jayson was nominated, not present, but Kevin reports he talked with Jayson, and he accepted. Kevin also was nominated, and he tentatively accepted. Treasurer: Casey was nominated, she accepted. Secretary: John was nominated last month; he tentatively accepted with the contingency that he cannot be both Secretary and Director. (Jessica also stated that based on her experience in Region 2, it's not a good thing to try to combine the Director and Secretary roles.) There were no other new nominations. PR: Pam was nominated last month; she accepted. Membership: Pan was nominated last month; she accepted. Land & Legislation: This had been split last year into North and South regions, with Kevin and Ed sharing the position. Both Kevin and Ed were renominated; Ed declines and Kevin tentatively accepts. Elections: will be held in January. Expo Funds: Casey reports the website was successfully canceled without needing to pay for 2022. Ed could not remember what had been decided in the past for the funds but identified that it was from likely 2014 or 2015; John has the records from then and will research the intents from the past. Casey reports that the total of savings and checking accounts is \$13,666.95. New Business: Venue: Casey announced that Alfy's will no longer be available after December as the property has been sold. 4WheelParts is no longer available due to a corporate-wide decision on their part to no longer host organizational meetings. Casey has contacted about 30 potential venues, most of which are either not available or way too expensive. She has narrowed things down to four: one of the other Alfy's locations, Denny's in Everett, Buzz Inn in

Everett, and Shawn O'Donnell's. She will further update us at the January meeting after she's been able to visit each of these venues for appropriateness.

Good of the Order: US Border Opening; the border is now opening allowing Canadians to return to Canada in less than 72 hours without COVID testing. Anticipating increased traffic in Washington as a result. Trail Jam 2022; The dates for this have been posted as of July 7-10. Further details will be coming, but please save the date! Engagement: John raised the question of engagement, as it seems that attendance at meetings and overall involvement has been decreasing—noting in particular that these Region 1 meetings seem to have been impacted as delegates from only 3 clubs regularly attend. Pam and Jessica note this is a trend that has been noted at the Association level and has led to encouragement for Future 4-Wheelers. Kevin also noted that fatigue with virtual meetings and COVID restrictions also seems to have made an impact.

Action Items: John to research records for the intentions for the Expo funds.

Raffle: Not held as this is not an in-person meeting.

Secretary's Report – Minutes were submitted to Tri-Power by Jessica and printouts were provided tonight. The motion was made by Brandon Marek and seconded by Derrick Clark to accept minutes as printed, motion passed.
